#### **Project granted**

In partnership with Civil Connections, a Danish-based non-governmental organisation, Early Care International has received the first small scale intervention grant from CISU-Civil Society in Development. With the grant, we aim to map the existing Early Childhood Development programmes and services with our local partner, Education for Sustainable Development in Ethiopia. The project runs from February 2022 until July 2022.

#### What is Expected from the project?

The national Early Childhood Development (ECD) programme in Ethiopia is cross-sectoral. The holistic needs of children are diverse and cannot be addressed by a single intervention from a single sector. However, from our discussion with the Ethiopian Ministry of Health and our local partner, Education for Sustainable Development, we have learned that ECD programmes across the sectors are not coordinated and lack a platform to start a more concentrated collaboration towards this coordination.

This small-scale intervention will provide the foundation for strengthening ECD programmes in Ethiopia. The following outputs are expected through this project: 1) Identification of existing Early Childhood Development (ECD) programmes and services in Ethiopia and the various actors involved in the area. 2) Determining if there are existing coordination

## Children and War Foundation

Due to the ongoing war in Ethiopia, many children face atrocities and become traumatised. There is no established knowledge to assess and treat children who have experienced trauma in Ethiopia. Early Care International is working closely with the Children and War Foundation (a Norwegian-based non-profit organisation) to provide trauma assessment and therapy training for front line workers to reach children affected by the conflict in Ethiopia.

#### **LEGO-Call**

Early Care International is partnering with the Danish-based NGO Civil Connections and other local organisations in Ethiopia and Uganda to apply for the LEGO Foundation 90th anniversary call on Early Childhood Development programmes.
